Oregon E-Cycles is a statewide program that provides free recycling of a variety of household electronics. Electronics manufacturers pay for recycling their products and work through MRM, a Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO).

Any Oregonian can take seven or fewer Covered Electronic Devices (CEDs) at a time to a participating Oregon E-Cycles collection site for free recycling.

The following locations are official collection sites for the Oregon E-Cycles program. A full directory of Oregon E-Cycles collections sites, including addresses and hours of operation, can be found at Oregonecycles.com

Focus On Oregon E-Cycles Program Changes

The Oregon E-Cycles program has existed for years. But did you know that now you can recycle even more kinds of household electronics? Previously, you've been able to recycle TVs, computers, printers, keyboards, and mice for free at approved Oregon E-Cycles collection sites but, starting this year, the list has expanded to include VCRs, DVD players, video game consoles, routers, modems, and more. You can find the full list of devices included in the Oregon E-Cycles program run by MRM at Oregonecycles.com.

Although the list has expanded, remember that the Oregon E-Cycles program is designed for residents, not businesses. This means that while any Oregonian can bring seven or fewer covered devices at a time for free recycling, if you have more than 7 items then you will need to demonstrate that the electronics come from a household or small business (meaning fewer than 10 employees).

In Oregon, it's free and easy to safely recycle TVs, computers, laptops, printers, monitors, tablets, and many more household electronics. Remember that you are limited to bringing no more than 7 covered devices at a time for free recycling. This is because the Oregon E-Cycles program is designed for residents and is not a business recycling program.
